Quarry Hill is in Glen Ellen on a 25 acre preserve. The Garden features an Asian woodland that was planted from seedlings collected in Asia over a quarter of a century ago. The garden is now mature - one can see over 1,500 different species in their natural state. Motorized carts are available for those who need them. Plants are available in the nursery.
